She helped me figure out the best sketchy site to get our estrogen and spiro, brings over the junkiest snacks and weirdest movies, and makes me laugh harder than anyone I've ever met. I took her in when her parents kicked her out for being trans, and she was supposed to take care of me when I was recovering from surgery. No one knows me better, and no one gives a shit about me more than

her. She's the one I called for support after I had to give up my money.

She also has a way of getting me to go out with her, whether I want to or not. If she shows up at my door, I won't be able to say no, so I better start getting ready. I probably should hang her clown painting back up, too, in case she uses the bathroom.

I look frumpy, unable to put together a decent outfit from my closet of questionable thrift store choices, I ended up wearing my usual: a black cami, ill-fitting blue jeans, and a pink dollar-store ball cap to hide my receding hairline that my bangs don't cover when they're greasy. My eyes are red from crying and my makeup is sloppy. Sloppy Isa—like Sloppy Joe, but a person instead of a sandwich.

The gallery is modest and barebones, the walls painted an appropriate white to showcase the art, and the floor is bare concrete. My sister Sarah is glaring down at me, the harsh lighting of the hospital room shines above her and stings my eyes. "Are you just going to be on your phone this whole time? Show some respect, Dad's dying."

"I'm not dead yet," my dad says from under a thin white sheet on a hospital bed. He looks more skeletal and bald than usual from the ineffective chemo, and he still hasn't opened his pudding cup on the tray before him... I wonder if it's good pudding. "It's okay, Ian. I'm sure it's not exciting being here."

I cringe but don't bother to correct him, and neither does my sister. He's the worst, he has no respect for me. When did he get like

this?

He was actually a pretty good father when I was a little kid, when he was still fat and mom was still around. He gave the best squishy hugs, would dress up like Santa every year, and he and my mom had an antique store filled with bizarre treasures. We used to do dumb boy shit like toss around a football and go fishing or whatever too. I didn't care for it much, but I was just happy to spend time with him. And those were the sort of things that boys did, weren't they?

It reads: Experimental feminization treatment for trans women. Safe and fast results. Non-invasive. Need test subjects for free treatments. Look how you feel inside. Feminine. Beautiful. Healthy.

Jesus Christ, Instagram ads are so creepy. It's like it was made just for me. It's so sketchy...but I'll bookmark it anyway.

CHAPTER FOUR

I'm sweating. I'm not this out of shape, am I? What am I doing following through on that sketchy ad? Am I crazy? I'll just check it out, and if it seems weird, I can go home. If he can make me look anything like those before and after photos on his website, then it'll be more than worth it. I check my phone. Argh. I'm late. I'm always late.

Of course the office is in a strip mall. Practically everything in LA is in some sort of mall. The outside is a smog-stained, off-white

stucco with faded green trim. A yellowed vinyl banner hangs on the side of the building, it has a blonde woman putting something in her mouth and smiling out at the passing cars of the busy street. Next to her are the words in bold, capital letters: WEIGHT LOSS REVERSE AGING HAPPINESS CLINIC: A *FREE* VISIT CAN CHANGE YOUR *LIFE*. Above the door in embossed green letters to match the trim is the name of the doctor: Dr. Henry S. Skurm.

I walk in and I'm struck by how clean the place is. The floors, furniture, and interior decorating haven't been updated since the 80s, but they're perfectly preserved and maintained. The lighting is warm and inviting, the office is empty and silent—I can hear my heavy breathing and beating heart. I'm so out of shape. There's a reception desk, it's empty except one of those service bells I hate. Only assholes ring those, but I'm late, so I give it a tap and the harsh tone echoes throughout the room. The tapping of shoes reverberates from the hallway.

It's a white guy in a lab coat, khakis, and a mint green polo shirt. His face is deeply unsettling in its perfection. I can't tell how old he is, it looks like he has zero pores and wrinkles, like his skin is made of matte porcelain. His eyes are a calming blue, his cheeks and lips are plump and a healthy rose color, and his face is so symmetrical, too symmetrical. He's like a 3D model from a video game with graphical capabilities that don't yet exist.

He smiles to reveal perfectly straight, blindingly white teeth. "You must be Isa, welcome."

"Sorry I'm late."

"It's fine, fine. Why don't we get started?"

He looks at me like he's expecting me to say something, but I completely zoned out. "Wow."

"We'll begin, then."

He has me stand up and spread out to take my measurements. My skin crawls as he lays his hands all over my body and says "hm" and "ah." He measures my facial features with one of those tools that went out of style with phrenology and then instructs me to strip naked and get in the vat. "I'll turn away for your privacy. The liquid in the athano—" He pauses and clears his throat. "The liquid in the tub is opaque and I won't be able to see your body."

Usually, I'd rather die than strip in front of a stranger, but I've gotten this far, so I take off my clothes. The coldness of the office presses on my skin, and it feels like the world can see my frumpy, half-manly bod. The liquid in the tub is thick like slime and pitch black. "Fantastic." The sounds of mechanical whirring and electronic beeping fill the air. "You may experience some unpleasant hallucinations. Let me assure you, you are perfectly safe."

Wait, what? The orb above me vibrates and turns obsidian. A hatch on the surface opens and a mechanical arm with a collar shoots down and snaps around my neck. I cry out and try to pull the collar apart, but it plunges me into the thick goo. I'm holding my breath, squeezing my eyes shut to keep this goo out of my body. What the fuck is happening? Is he going to kill me?

Some sort of liquid rushes out from jets in the side of this perverse jacuzzi, watering down the goo. It's hot—scalding. I'm being cooked alive and want to scream out. It feels like my flesh is melting off my body, but it couldn't be, it couldn't be. The taste of rotting vegetables seeps into my lips, and I open my eyes, the liquid is almost clear now, and I can see my skin melting off—not like candle wax, but like it's decaying. Like one of those nature shows where they leave an animal to rot and speed up the film. I thrash my limbs about, as if that will slow the process. My hand—oh god—all the flesh and muscle is gone. Carts slowly travel on a track that leads into the sharp-toothed mouth of a giant clown head. Green spirals swirl on its bulging yellow eyes. The sign above it says RIDE ME OR DIE. I don't remember this ride, but I haven't been to the county fair in years. I shudder. "Don't tell Mitzy, but I'm not really crazy about clowns."

Rayna smacks me in the shoulder. "Come on! It's like a demented circus inside of a circus. How meta is that? We have to go."

I don't want to disappoint her, and while psycho-clowns give me the creeps, it's not a serious phobia or anything. "Okay, sure."

I hand a couple of tickets to the carny, and he lets us in with impressive maniacal laughter. I wonder how many years it took him to perfect that? We hop on to the slow-moving, bright red cart made for two and pass under the sharp teeth of the clown head. Rayna puts her arm around me with a mischievous grin as the safety bar lowers down on to our laps, locking us in. Maybe this isn't such a bad idea, after all.

It's dark, hard to see, but I can hear creepy carnival music ahead of us. I offer Rayna some kettle corn. She refuses and rifles into her bag, pulling out a metal flask, and taking a generous swig before turning to me. I can see her snake-yellow eyes gleam from the light growing closer. She puts her arm around me again. "Want some? It's Absinthe. The real stuff, with wormwood."

She wiggles the bottle. "C'mon, Isa. The green fairy is calling."

I go to take a modest sip, but she tips up the end of the flask with a finger, encouraging me to drink more. She looks...delighted? Well, when in a demented circus ride, I guess. The burning liquid travels down my throat as the music gets louder, and the first scene of the ride comes into view.

We approach the facade of a yellow and red striped circus tent. An animatronic, mustachioed man in a suit and top hat gestures mechanically into the tent opening again and again. I sigh and stuff a handful of popcorn in my mouth.

"Ladies and gentlemen, boys and girls: Step right up, step right up for the greatest show known to man. Ladies and gentlemen, boys and girls..."

We continue through the tent opening and a wooden figure of an acrobat passes above our head with a cackle, its feet almost hitting us. Rayna laughs, and the chipped and faded figure slides up the cable to its original position. The creepy circus music floats through the dusty air, repeating one maddening bar over and over. Animatronic monkeys with glowing red eyes juggle human eyeballs to the right of us. On the other side, a skeleton wearing a clown suit and a blue afro wig points at us, roaring with high-pitched laughter. We're about to pass through into the next scene, and a taxidermy jaguar bolts out from behind a tent wall with a roar, its bloody jaws coming within inches of Rayna's face. She shrieks with delight and

puts her other arm around me, holding me tight, her face coming closer to mine. I stop myself from gasping. Next to that is THE PSYCHIC BEARDED LADY, sitting on a stool in an Eastern European embroidered dress. She has a crystal ball with a ghostly face floating in it, and a set of tarot cards laid out.

And to our right is THE FATTEST CANNIBAL ON EARTH wearing a baby blue muumuu. He takes up almost the entire side of the room and is covered in fake blood—or ketchup—and mustard, repeating the motion of taking a cooked human arm from a pile of body parts and putting it up to his chattering, mechanical mouth. Behind him is a wall of ovens with people inside, moaning and banging on the glass to be let out. Jesus-fucking-Christ. To my horror, Rayna apparently thinks this is hilarious and bursts out laughing and pointing. She grabs my kettle corn and starts throwing handfuls of it at the fatphobic caricature. I sink in the seat; she's watched me stuff my face with popcorn all night.

Unbelievable, she's acting so...gross. I thought she was a good person. My shoulders tense, and I cross my arms, but she doesn't seem to notice. We coast into the next scene under an opening with the sign that says THE FREAKIEST FREAK IN ALL OF HUMAN HISTORY! Great.

It's a hall of mirrors. Dozens of Raynas and Isas surround us, their faces and bodies stretched, squashed, inflated in the funhouse reflections. The spectator, the ultimate freak. Is this supposed to be some of joke or artistic statement? It doesn't even make sense.

I sigh and brush the popcorn crumbs off my lap, keeping my head down as Rayna cackles even harder, pointing at her face distorted in the mirror. She turns to me, wiping away tears from laughter. Her outburst fades into a giggle and she notices I'm pissed. Her expression turns to concern and she tries to put her arms around me, but I shrink away.

We're finally through the mirrors, the ride is over. Rayna steps out of the cart and grabs my hand tight, helping me out. She's not letting go. "What's wrong? You're mad."

Its skin drapes like a cloak, I can see the hair growing from it. Is that a large flap of skin, or the surface of its body? Its head is even more disturbing. It's the size and shape of a basketball, and it's covered in eyes with a small patch of brown hair on top. Are the eyes looking at me? Are they functional? They're blinking. And the last is me. I'm wheeled into position next to eyeball skin cloak. What an unnerving

neighbor. But he was human once too, like me. He's still human, I'm still human. Aren't we?

The red curtain slides open and we're hit with blinding stage lights. There's clapping, muffled and barely audible from inside my cage. The seating area of the theater isn't large—it could fit maybe fifty people, and it's only about half full. Straight ahead in the middle of the audience is a sort of long desk lit by a spotlight. A woman and two men sit behind it, and each has a screen facing us, attached to the side of the desk and lined up with their seat. They're dressed in fancy clothes and have large colorful buttons in front of them. What is this? Are they judges? Is this some sort of twisted version of American Idol?

Wait...they look familiar. The woman is pale and blonde and wearing an off-the-shoulder white dress with bright red lipstick and the longest fake-eyelashes I've ever seen. Holy shit, that's Kimmi! What is she doing here? The fit guy next to her—is he a celebrity too? He has a shaved head and wears a navy suit with no tie. I swear I've seen those thick, white-rimmed circular glasses before. Isn't he a famous director? Danny Laker—that's his name. The massive white guy on the other side of her, he's famous too. He's that body builder who started Improved U. They make the supplements that my dad tried to sell me, and the classes and juice fasts and coffee alternatives that influencers are always plugging on social media.

It's hard to see who else is in the audience, except in the front row where I see Dr. Skurm's gleaming face. He's wearing what looks like a fancy suit—black, but no tie. He still has his right hand, like nothing happened, and rolls the fingers as if he knows I'm looking at it. And next to him is Rayna. What the hell is she wearing? Is that a ball gown? Gold sequins and spaghetti straps, low cut and long—it looks designer. Why are they dressed like they're at some sort of award show? She smiles and gives a slight wave. I scream and bang on the wall with my fists. "You fucking bitch! How could you do this to me!"

Why waste my energy? I don't think they can even hear me. I plop down and cover my face with my long fingers. Tears stream

down my cheeks, and I can sense that stupid basketball head's eyes on me. What the fuck is happening? None of this makes any sense.

A man in a white suit holding a microphone steps into view from the edge of the stage and addresses the audience. He looks Greek or Italian or something and has a waxed black mustache that's curled at the ends. I can't make out what he's saying, but he's working the crowd and gesturing to us. The audience claps.

After a short speech, he walks in front of the bird guy and dramatically gestures to him. More clapping, but not as loud. The judges talk and the audience turns to them. The Improved U guy says something with a shit-eating grin and the audience bursts into laughter. He slams on a button and the screen lights up with an I. Kimmi returns his grin and slams a button. Her screen lights up with the Roman numeral for two. Danny Laker has his arms crossed. He puts his hand up to his chin and strokes it and speaks before pressing the button with one finger. His screen lights up with a II.

The crowd claps and the man in the white suit walks to the bioluminescent, anime statue girl. He introduces her and knocks on her glass, gesturing for her to stand up. She stands and seems to glow brighter. He makes a spinning motion with his finger. She obliges and turns in a circle to show her entire body, making eye contact with me on her way around, with no expression. She faces forward again, and the lights turn off to better show her glow. For a moment, she and I are the only ones in the room, like I'm gazing at a single sad star in the middle of a moonless sky. The lights turn on, the judges are discussing. In succession they press their buttons: the fitness guy gives a V, Kimmi gives a III, and movie director gives a IV. The audience claps.

The man in the white suit steps toward my neighbor, beach ball head. Before he can even give his introductory gesture, all the judges slam their buttons, giving him a I. Harsh. A man in the audience storms out of the theater as the judges and audience laugh.

The white suit guy comes up to my cage, looking at me with a stretched smirk. Dr. Skurm and Rayna are leaning forward, and Rayna's fingers interlace. I guess this is their big fucking moment.

The man knocks on the glass and gestures for me to stand. I cover my head in my hands and make my body as small as possible. Maybe they'll disappear, maybe I'll turn invisible. Through my fingers, I see Skurm and Rayna shift in their seats and glance at each other. The man gestures again, but I'm staying seated. I'm not here. This isn't happening. He takes out a small remote and presses a button, electrifying the floor and sending a shooting pain into my ass and legs. My body stands up before I can stop it with my stubbornness. The crowd claps.

He motions for me to spin around, so I do. Pathetic. The crowd is still clapping, Skurm and Rayna grin and turn to the audience and judges. The judges beam and nod at each other. They press their buttons, V, V, V. They clap and the two men stand up, others in the audience stand as well, their cheers are audible but muffled. Skurm and Rayna are hugging. She looks so happy. The whole audience is on their feet, even Kimmi, giving me a standing ovation. A perfect score for being the perfect freak.

Skurm and Rayna turn toward me, yelling something I can't make out and waving their arms like they're congratulating or thanking me. Rayna blows me a kiss, she has tears in her eyes. The red curtain closes.

It's dark except for the glow of freak #2, and in her light, I see a stagehand walk toward me. He takes control of the cage and wheels me out of the room, leaving the rest of them behind. We roll down the hall until he takes me into an elevator with B2 over the door. He presses the button to go to B5. We're underground, and now we're going deeper.

I doubt I'm going to some sort of after-party in my honor, at least not one I'd like to attend. I stare at the man with my palms to the glass, hoping he'll look up at me and realize I'm a human being, but he just looks at the closed elevator door. This is ride is taking forever, it's only supposed to be three floors down.

The elevator comes to a halt and the doors open to reveal a cavern-like tunnel, lit with a line of oil lamps mounted on its off-white and light-brown stony walls. Are we really in a cave? Or is this a set?

I'm wheeled down the tunnel into a massive opening. Hundreds of delicate stalactites hang from the ceiling and large stalagmites rise from the ground, flanking the path. I'm wheeled toward a small amphitheater carved out of the stone and lit by standing lamps. It faces an area to my right that's shrouded in darkness. This is definitely a real cave. How deep are we?

Twenty or so figures in black cloaks sit on the stone benches. I can see their suits and dresses underneath some of them—these are the same people from the twisted beauty pageant. What is this? Some sort of alchemy cult? They see me and stand up again, giving me a second standing ovation. I feel a tinge of pride. For what? I don't know, maybe it's just reflexive.

I'm rolled past them into the dark corner of the cave. There's the muted sound of a large metal latch, and the soft creaking of a hinge. I'm pushed over a threshold on to unpaved ground. The sound of a metal door slamming rings out behind me. The door must be heavy if I can hear it through the plexiglass.

All I can see are the cloaked figures sitting in the amphitheater behind a series of massive, spread-out bars that reach the ceiling, and there's a mesh cage over it, sealing the gaps that I could walk through. Great, another cage.

A mechanism releases, and the walls of my plexiglass case fall open. I'm grateful to be out, but my gut tells me my situation hasn't improved. Stumbling across the straw floor, I reach the bars covered by a mesh cage wall and bang my palms on it. "Let me out, you psychos! I participated in your twisted beauty pageant, now let me out! I'm a fucking human being!"

They ignore me and light candles, each one holding their own, and murmur a chant. I can make out some of their faces in the candlelight. Skurm is in the front row again with Rayna. They're wearing red cloaks instead of black, I guess that's the gold star they get for changing me into a prize-winning freak.

Their chanting grows louder, it's in a language I don't understand —maybe Latin. They raise their candles above their heads with thunderous voices that echo off the walls of the cavern, then fall silent in perfect unison. The cultists blow out their candles. The click

of a large switch echoes in the cave. A man in overalls activated it, and it belongs to a control panel built into the cave wall next to the audience. Floodlights in the cage turn on, illuminating the space.

Opposite the cage wall is a large opening. It's unlit and I can't see inside. Strewn about are human bones and skulls, the one at my feet is distorted, lengthened with an enormous jaw. Some skulls and skeleton pieces are just as transformed, and others appear normal. This is bad.

Heavy breathing comes from the darkened opening. It's a beast for sure, but it's so loud—too loud for it to be the size of a normal animal like a lion. Footsteps accompany the breathing, sounding like a car being dropped, shaking the ground more and more as whatever-it-is gets closer. I run to the cage wall. The audience has their hoods off and I can see their faces. They're so excited, like they're watching the season finale of their favorite show. I'm surprised no one's selling popcorn or hotdogs. Skurm looks more self satisfied than anything, and Rayna—is she crying? If she regrets betraying me, maybe she can help. I grab the mesh of the cage as the booming footsteps get closer. "Rayna, help! Save me, please! I don't want to die! I don't want to die!"

A hot gust of wind hits my back, followed by a horrible, deafening sound, like the death rattle of a hundred elephants. I turn around and at the tunnel entrance is a 50 foot...thing. It's taller than my three-story apartment building! I can't believe what I'm seeing. Its torso is the shape of a giant chicken, but it's covered in scales, and the wings are webbed and reptilian. It has a tail four times the length of its body that looks like a snake. Sprouting from its torso are three long goose-like necks, each topped with a different bird's head—one black like a crow, one white like a swan, and one red.

What's in the middle of the beast's chest is registering with me, and I blink my eyes and shake my head to make sure I'm seeing what I think I'm seeing. Most of the beast's front side is covered by the massive scowling face of an old man with a pointy nose and chin, and a long beard that almost reaches the ground. And if that wasn't absurd enough, its human-like legs are half-red and don't have toes—they look like little red boots and have wings sprouting

from the ankles. I'm dreaming, I must be dreaming, this can't be real, it's too insane.

The monster's old man face flares its nostrils and sniffs at me, as the three bird heads weave and bob through the air on their long necks, scoping out the area. The thing roars from the face, and that Godzilla-with-strep-throat sound bursts out from its toothless mouth and hits me with a wave of hot breath and spit. My head swims from the foul smell of decay. This is no dream. This is some ancient THING that those maniacs out there summoned, and I'm the sacrifice. Or they just get their kicks watching a freak in a bikini get eaten alive by some fantasy monster. Either way, I'm fucked.

Its snake-tail whips and strikes me in the side. The force sends me flying to the corner, and I land on a pile of bones and skulls. A crusty broken rib in the pile pierces my side, but the wound is only superficial. The beast is stomping toward me, its bird heads now as focused on me as its old man face.

I'm not fucked. This is a final boss, and every final boss can be defeated. I just have to figure out its patterns and find its weakness. I pick up a bone from the pile and hurl it at the monster. It rotates through the air and bounces off the massive brow—so close to the eye. The face twists into an annoyed expression, but the beast doesn't stop stepping toward me.

I pick up a skull, it looks human but with sabretooth fangs. I stand and wind back my throwing arm, but the middle bird head, the one with red feathers, winds back too. It looks like it's going to scream or strike or—the beast's body tips down and the red bird head charges toward me, straightening its serpentine neck taught. I spring up and roll away with the skull just before the beak slams into the corner of the wall where I stood. I run behind the creature, trying to stay away from the lashing tail. The red bird head chews on the pile of straw and bones, and the pieces fall out on to the floor as it turns toward me. The old man face looks super pissed, and it lets out monstrous grunts.

I can do this. Focus. I throw the skull into the eye of its human face, and the sabre teeth burrow deep into the bulging eyeball. Yes! The beast sways from side to side while it groans and blinks, trying

to dislodge the skull from its eye. The bird heads crane down, assessing if they can safely pull the skull out with their beaks. That middle one with the red feathers seems like it's in charge, maybe if I kill it, I can survive this.

I pick up an oversized rib from the ground and slip it behind my back under the elastic band of the bikini. Running toward the beast, I jump on to the beard, gripping it with my hands and putting one hand over another to climb up to its chin. The creature shakes its body from side to side, wagging the beard and swinging me like someone trying to get a bug off their sleeve. And like a bug, I hold on tight and climb up every moment that the beard is stable enough. The pointy end of the rib jabs into my back with the movement. Cheers and boos ring out from the audience.

The beast is still. I dig my nails into the flesh of its chin and pull myself up until I'm crouching on top of it. These new joints are finally making sense. I can do this. I grasp the massive bottom lip, squeezing lumps of its blueish flesh. The white bird head is trying to pick the skull out of its human eye, the red bird has its sights on me and looks pissed, and the black bird...is coming right at me!

I scramble up the lip and into the foul, toothless mouth. At least I hope its toothless. The gums of the creature clamp down, and the wet flaps engulf my body. I squirm and scramble to grab its pulsating tongue as it grinds me between its gums, clamping down harder and harder. If my bones weren't flexible, they'd have broken from the force. It's swallowing and the suction is pulling me deeper into the mouth. I grasp for something, anything to hold on to so I'm not eaten alive. The beast has a tooth after all—it's the size of a large suitcase, and I wrap my arms around it, finding handholds in two cavities. The monster draws my body back and lashes at me with its tongue as I hold on tight. I let myself go limp while keeping my grip on the tooth, and my body flails with the motion of the tongue without resistance.

I wonder what would happen if I just let go? Would it hurt? Would it hurt to slip into the mouth of a monster and disappear forever? If I never want to be seen again anyway, why fight it?

The tongue stops and the old man face of the monster screams in frustration. I force myself out of its mouth, back on to its chin and

jump with my hands up toward the nose, catching a long nose hair and the edge of a nostril. The crowd gasps. I lift myself to the top of the nose and straddle it before the creature shakes its body again. But I hold tight... It's just like a bull machine at a bar. I can do this.

The beast is still for a moment, making a sound like it's trying to clear its old man throat. Scrambling to my feet, I run up the slope of the nose and lunge off the brow, landing on the base of the neck of the red bird head. The feathers make it easy to climb, and I'm fast enough to dodge a strike from the beak of the black bird. I'm at the base of the head. I steady myself as I feel for the weapon on my back. Shit. It's gone. It fell out when I was in the mouth!

I'll have to use my long, freaky arms and fingers. I pull myself up on to the beak and plunge my arms into its eye socket, grasping the sides of its beach ball sized, black eyeball in my hands. The eye detaches as I pull at it with all my strength. The bird head screeches and tips back and I tumble off hugging the massive eyeball. I drop it and pull at feathers to slow my descent before I land, bouncing off the squishy bird eye on the ground below me. It cushions my fall, but the impact still rattles my body with pain.

The beast is freaking out, spasming and shaking. It regains composure and spins, charging toward me, and the red bird head strikes with its beak. I turn and it barely misses me. It plummets into the cavern wall, causing it to cave-in and shards of stone to fly out. Holy shit, this thing is pissed. It's blinded by rage—and maybe I can use this to my advantage.

I run around the beast to the giant bars and mesh wall of the cage, and turn to face it, positioning my body in the center of two of the massive bars. I give my best crow imitation. "Caw! Caw!"

It works. The sharp beak flies toward me, and at the last second, I collapse to the floor. It hits the mesh metal wall above me and tears a hole through it. A woman screams. The monster wriggles somewhat, its beak and head stuck in the hole it created. It yanks its head out, and I stand and dive through the opening, out of the cage. I'm free!

And I'd be celebrating if there wasn't a crowd of cultists staring at me in shock, regaining their composure at any moment. The massive sound of rattling cage bars and the monstrous body thumping against them snaps the cultists out of their confusion. The front row rushes forward with their arms out to restrain me—except Skurm and Rayna, who're still dumbfounded. Others jump over stone seats to join the party. They're grabbing, grappling, grasping at me, but they can't get a hold of me. My body is too slick from the monster's saliva, and I can bend and flex away with ease. I swim amid the mass of arms and legs and torsos and make my way through. A hand squeezes the back of my neck and pulls me around. It's that Improved U guy, and the grip of his huge hand is so strong—I can't get out of it. He knows he has me and gives me a nasty grin. I make eye contact with the monster and squeeze out another crow call. "Caw caw!"

The monster tips down and forces its red bird head through the hole in the bars. The beak plummets through the cultists toward me, knocking them to the ground and into the air. I fall on to my back and push up the Improved U guy with my feet. He's scooped up into the beak, and it releases his grip by severing his arm as it engulfs his body. He's crushed into a bloody pulp, and the sound of his breaking bones escapes the bird's mouth.

I scramble to my feet and bolt up the side of the amphitheater toward the control panel, grabbing a standing lamp, smashing its glass globe to make a staff with an end of sharp glass. I'm so much faster with these long, springy limbs. Cultists from the second row charge toward me, led by Danny Laker, and I plunge my weapon into his chest at the same time the creature slams into the cage wall. He falls back, knocking the rest over in a domino effect. Another is rushing me from above, I turn my body and swing the lamp, hitting him in the head with the metal base. The next one I stab in the face. I'm reach the control panel. The workman yells at me from across the cave. "No! Don't touch that!"

I flip every switch I see and then smash it with the lamp. The sound of the massive latch of the cage door unlocking reverberates, followed by the horrified gasps of the cultists. Three cultists jump on top of me, but I squirm free from the dog pile to see the monster bursting out of the gate. The huge cage door swings open and slams

into at least half of the cultists sending them flying like bowling pins. Skurm and Rayna escape the path of the cage, but the monster is heading right for them as the bird heads snatch up cultists, crushing them in their beaks and feeding their mashed up bodies to the old man face, who slurps down the remains into his toothless mouth with delight.

The black bird head scoops up Skurm in its beak as the red one goes for Rayna. She's fast enough to get away, but Skurm isn't as lucky, the beast bites down on his body and shakes its head, sending the top half of the doctor flying to the floor. He lands with a thunk and yellow and white guts spill out in a rush of blue fluid, and dangle from the bottom of his severed torso. Rayna turns toward him and screams. He lifts his head, a massive crack is across his face. The fracture branches at his forehead, and a shard of the surface falls off, leaving a hole with only blackness behind it. He crawls to her, clawing at the cave floor, and reaches his hand out.

Someone is at my right shoulder. I whip back my arm with my pivoting joint and hit something with a crack. It's Kimmi, and she's holding her bloody nose. I push her to the ground. "I looked up to you! I danced to your music and dreamed about buying your clothes!"

Her eyes are wide in terror, she's stuttering. I turn back to the monster. "Caw! Caw!"

I bolt for the tunnel that leads to the elevator as the creature charges forward, its old man face twisted in rage. The surviving cultists follow, at this point they probably aren't as interested in catching me as much as they want to escape. But I'm a good 15 feet ahead of them. The beast is behind us and gaining fast, I hear the screams of the people crushed under the ridiculous red boot-like feet of the monster and torn apart by its beaks.

The cave ceiling tapers down toward the tunnel and the monster bashes into the lower hanging stalactites. Rocks crash to the ground in a hail of stone behind me as I jump into the tunnel. I'm in, I did it. I turn as I run and stop when I see the opening—it's covered in large stone debris. And there's...silence. I'm panting, trying to catch my breath. I think I did it.

Rocks fly toward me, propelled by the massive red bird head jamming its way into the tunnel, and a rock the size of a toaster strikes me in the shoulder, knocking me down. The open, sharp beak of the red bird's head rushes toward me. I scream and cover my face. This is it.

But it stops short. Its neck isn't long enough to reach me. I run to the elevator and jam the up button. The door opens and I rush in, smashing the B2 button. The door closes as the red bird head thrashes and screeches, banging itself on the walls of the tunnel, smashing the gas lamps on the wall, letting out splatters of fire.

I made it. I'm getting out of here. But not before I find the others.


